



# Medication Assisted Treatment Access Points Awards Tribal Infrastructure Support 2019-2020

### Big Valley Band of Pomo Indians Lake County \$75,000

To culturally integrate MAT services by increasing treatment space and purchasing telehealth equipment in Lake County.

#### Greenville Rancheria Tehama County \$75,000

To expand MAT services and organizational capacity through the purchase of improved electronic health record software and equipment in Tehama County.

### Indian Child and Family Preservation Program Sonoma County \$50,200

To improve community MAT services by creating space for group work, trainings, and education sessions on treatment options in Sonoma County, while exploring telemedicine options, and also ensuring all staff are trained in overdose response.

### K'im:a Medical Center Humboldt County \$75,000

To expand existing MAT services and increase clients served through capital improvements and campus expansion in Humboldt County.

#### Pinoleville Pomo Nation Mendocino County \$75,000

To start-up MAT services by creating a dedicated wrap-around opioid treatment program in Mendocino County through new building renovations and capital improvements.

The MAT Access Points Project is funded through the Department of Health Care Services' California MAT Expansion Project and is administered and managed by The Center at Sierra Health Foundation.

### Round Valley Indian Health Center Mendocino County \$75,000

To start-up MAT services by creating dedicated MAT office space for telehealth and in-person services, strengthening current telehealth contracts, and exploring additional partnerships in Mendocino County.

### Sacramento Native American Health Center, Inc. Sacramento County \$75,000

To enhance MAT services at new clinic site in Sacramento County through the creation of dedicated MAT service space to host classes, workshops, and support groups and integrating behavioral health with treatment services.

# Sonoma County Indian Health Project, Inc. Sonoma County \$75,000

To expand current MAT services and increase clients served through multi-use space expansion in Sonoma County that will create a dedicated MAT space and improve coordination between medical and behavioral health services.

# Tule River Tribe Tulare County \$75,000

To improve alcohol and SUD education, prevention, and intervention services and programmatically prepare to launch MAT services through the renovations of a youth center in Tulare County where youth will be able to engage in multiple activities.

### United American Indian Involvement, Inc. Los Angeles County \$75,000

To integrate MAT service into the current SUD treatment provided through the build-out of a designated MAT consultation and treatment room in the new facility in Los Angeles County.

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
