To establish MAT services for AI/AN communities in Fresno County by participating in the learning community and by developing policies and procedures that incorporate best practices, create a stigma reduction campaign, and collaborate with local SUD service providers and programs.

Friendship House Association of American Indians

Alameda and San Francisco Counties

\$150,000.00

To strengthen MAT services for AI/AN communities in the Bay Area by participating in the learning community and by expanding provided culturally competent services, deepening partnerships and increasing regional leadership, and developing an organizational sustainability plan.

Mathiesen Memorial Health Clinic

Tuolumne County

\$150,000.00

To strengthen MAT services for AI/AN communities in Tuolumne County by participating in the learning community and by developing a train-the-trainer model to create responsive, comprehensive support teams that will enhance staffs' knowledge of the healing role of culture in patient engagement, treatment and recovery, and also improve communication avenues for patients through signage and web site development.
