**Inyo County**

**\$149,292.00**

To increase access to OUD treatment services by expanding offered MOUD telehealth services, hiring a Tribal SUN, and enhancing coordination efforts with programs to integrate traditional practices into treatment services in Inyo and Mono counties.

**Fresno American Indian Health Project**

**Fresno County**

**\$150,000.00**

To strengthen the existing MAT program and behavioral health services in Fresno County by establishing internal policies and procedures, incorporating cultural practices into MAT services and increasing staffing supports.

**K'ima:w Medical Center**

**Humboldt County**

**\$150,000.00**

To utilize OUD treatment best practices and incorporate cultural classes to strengthen clinical MAT services while also increasing community education and hosting a fentanyl summit in Humboldt County.

**Round Valley Indian Health Center**

**Mendocino County**

**\$150,000.00**

To provide culturally centered healing MAT and recovery services and improve patient outcomes by incorporating traditional practices and trauma-informed care activities in Mendocino County.

**\$150,000.00**

To increase participation in MAT outpatient services by increasing staff capacity, creating a marketing plan, and providing client incentives to engage with treatment programs in Sonoma County.

**\$150,000.00**

To expand access to culturally competent MAT services and improve care coordination by increasing staff capacity, incorporating screening, treatment and recovery in the organizational system, strengthening outreach activities, and improving sustainability pathways in San Francisco County.

**Toiyabe Indian Health Project**

**Inyo County**

**\$148,740.00**

To improve MAT services by reinstating a multi-disciplinary team to ensure program implementation, address treatment needs of individuals with dual-diagnosis or co-occurring disorders, and providing community educational outreach in Inyo and Mono counties.
