How can we receive timely responses to questions about this funding opportunity?	Many applicant questions must be sent to various departments within DHCS to receive an appropriate answer, and this often takes time. We appreciate your patience.
Eligibility	
Do we have to be a 501(c)(3) to apply?	No, you do not need non-profit status to apply.
If we already have a SUD program and offer MAT services, can we still apply?	Yes, you may still apply, if you have an NTP license.

If our organization is not an NTP, but we provide medications for SUD through mobile street medicine, would we be able to partner with an NTP to qualify? Or does the project have to be fully driven by an NTP?	Yes, you may partner with an NTP to apply. The NTP must have a valid DHCS license, be able to demonstrate Drug Medi-Cal enrollment, have a valid DEA registration and SAMHSA accreditation. The NTP must hold the contract.

Target Populations

"All licensed NTPs are encouraged to apply, with priority being given to NTPs wanting to expand their services via an MU and/or an MNTP to prioritize rural communities, correctional facilities, local DHCS licensed residential substance use disorder facilities that do not offer MAT, and Indigenous and Native communities."

Yes, you may still apply. In your application please be clear which populations you serve and their limitations for receiving MAT in the past.
